It's time again for TGoM's Spring 2013 Hammer-In May 31, June 1 and 2,


- * Camping on-site is available Friday night and Saturday night on primitive sites

Knife Sharpening Open House

Saturday June 1, 2013 Paul Widenhoefer will be hosting an informal open house in his shop about sharpening knives and talking about the process. He will demonstrate sharpening using several different methods throughout the day, including sharpening on a natural stones, diamond stones, Japanese water stones, sharpening with a belt grinder/sander and honing and stropping. He will show you how to sharpen anything you want, except your wit. If you want to actually sharpen one of your own knives or other cutting tools, bring them along.

This is a Guild event that is free to members and prospective members. A donation is suggested to cover materials if you intend to do any sharpening.



Bronze Pour II

Saturday & Sunday, May 4th & 5th. 9:00 am to 4:30 pm- Mold Making Saturday May 11th. 1:00 p.m. - Evening- The Pour

This event is open to the public but I want to give priority to Guild members. 1st come 1st serve, so if you're interested, sign up early.

Instructors: Marty Hicks, Don Halverson, and help from others

Cost: \$85 Class size: 10

Location: Marty's (HIXWERX) Workshop

Everyone is welcome to the pattern making workshop which will give you an idea of what's possible to cast.

We'll look at examples and talk about ways of creating a pattern to get a successful casting. We'll also give an overview of mold making including sprue and vent systems.

Mixing non-toxic, binded sand, we'll make two part (cope and drag) molds, and cut sprues and vents. You will need: eye protection, proper clothing, and any tools you have for working the mold. The size limit for the pattern is equal to or less than the volume of a baseball. Larger

patterns may be optional for experienced participants.

Everyone is welcome to the pour the evening of May 11th but there is a limit of ten to cast a piece. We'll be casting "Everdur", a silicon bronze excellent for artwork and taking a patina. Work will start early in the day, but we'll probably light the furnace around 3:30 pm for an evening pour.






