
We will also have blacksmithing demonstrations starting late afternoon. Bring a friend to introduce to the craft. We are betting that Myron will offer to bring a coal forge.



The first five years of the Metalsmith are now on line in the Guild Members Only section of the web forum, with more being added. The Guild membership directory has also been posted online in the Members Only section of the web forum. We currently have 245 Guild members on the Bellows email reflector and 79 registered users on the web forum.

Please know that we plan to maintain a continually updated Membership Directory in the Guild members-only portion of the Bellows. The information listed will be: name, address, phone number, email address, and membership expiration date. Participants will be given masonite and plasticine clay to create their artwork, from which a mold will be made. If you have something else that you'd like to cast we can negotiate.

Mold Making.

The Pour.

Pattern Making Workshop.

Everyone is welcome to the pattern making workshop which will give you an idea of what's possible to cast. We'll look at examples and talk about ways of creating a pattern to get a successful casting. We'll also give an overview of mold making including sprue and vent systems.

Mixing non-toxic, binded sand, we'll make two-part (cope and drag) molds, and cut sprues and vents. We'll be casting "Everdur", a silicon bronze excellent for artwork and taking a patina. You will need to bring: eye protection, leather gloves, proper clothing, and any tools you have for working the mold.

Everyone is welcome to the pour the evening of August 31st but there is a limit of ten to cast a piece. Work will start early in the day but we'll light the furnace at 3:30 pm for an evening pour.

## Mark Pearce's Pre-Conference Candelabra Class

Dates: Thursday and Friday, September 19 & 20, 2013, Start time 9:00am

Fee: \$170 per student

Max students: 15

Location: Little Log House Antique Power Show grounds, Hastings MN (map below)

This fall's pre-conference class features Mark Pearce, one of our demonstrators for the 2013 Fall Conference, leading participants through how to make a candelabra fit for a dining room table. If you have been jonesing for a project that is a little more complex in scope, requiring several components forged to size and fitted together, but would like the safety net of having a subject matter expert on hand to help you through any "learning moments," then this class is for you.

This class will give participants a chance to work on a number of traditional design features under the watchful eye of a skilled black-smith. The candelabra will incorporate penny scrolls, taper scrolls, blow overleaf scrolls as well as a tapered, twisted shaft and a raised flat bar for a base.

There is no firm pre-requisite level for this class, Mark says any skill level is welcome as long as they have used a hammer and tongs before. Processes will include forging to dimension, scrolling, chiseling, punching, forge welding and others.

So take a few days off before the Conference to join 14 of your fellow Guild members in Hastings. These classes always prove educational and a good time. Who knows, you might even knock out one more thing to display in the gallery.

Tools and Equipment or other items participants are to bring to the class. Students will need to bring their own coal forge and anvil for this class. If you either aren't able to move your forge yourself or you don't have a coal forge let us know and we will see what we can arrange. Additionally students should bring: forge tools (rake, shovel, etc); 5 gallons buckets for coal and a slack tub, an ash pail, hammer, tongs, wire brush, flux, twisting wrench, chisels and punches. We'll bring the coal.

**Safety Equipment** – safety glasses & ear plugs are mandatory. Other safety equipment may include: gloves, leather apron, cotton clothing, leather shoes.

Other Equipment: If you only have an electric blower on your forge you will want to bring an extension cord or two to make sure you can reach an outlet.


**Special Instructions:** 9AM is when the class will be starting. Please factor in how much time it is going to take to download and set up your equipment when planning your departure and arrival times. Equipment can be set up the evening before. Camping onsite is available at the same rates as for conference.

Lunch Arrangements: Students will need to bring their own lunch. A grill will be brought for those who wish to use it.

# Classes at Tunnel Mill for 2013

Nathan Robertson - August 3, 2013, Hand Hammer and August 4, 2013 Sledge Hammer

**Ric Furrer** - August 23, 24 and 25, 2013, Wootz Crucible Steel

Weekend demonstration of making and forging Wootz Crucible steel with Ric Furrer. Wootz is the steel used in many of the famous Persian and Indian sword blades and research into its creation spawned the field of Microscopy in Europe. Some call it the "true Damascus".

Watch (and maybe help a bit) as Ric demonstrates the melting of the raw material in a crucible heated by a charcoal fire, making of the solid ingot and carefully forging that ingot of steel into bar. From there the audience gets to pick what the bar will become. Each step will be described and demonstrated in detail.

The history, chemistry, and art of this material will be told though stories, pictures and old examples. Ric promises not to put too many people to sleep with the chemistry talk.

In 2014 there will be a week long hands on class at TunnelMill. Come see what all the fuss is about. Ric Furrer has been making a wootz for over 14 years and has traveled throughout the US, Europe and India studying old blades. He began blacksmithing under the instruction of Paul Marx in Madison, WI some 23 years ago and has since focused on ancient and medieval metalworking. In 2002 he demonstrated at the Smithsonian Institution in Washington DC and was featured on NOVA "Secrets of the Viking Sword" in 2012. His shop, Door County Forgeworks, is located in Sturgeon Bay, WI.

His English is good, and he will be accompanied by Allen Rozen, a smith from Toronto, who has been arranging Taro's workshops in Canada and the US.

### **Guild educational grants**

There is grant money available for Guild members to study intermediate and advanced metalworking techniques.

Participants are given money to pay for a portion of their expenses and are expected to learn some new or poorly understood skill, and then to share what they have learned with other members and the public through an article in our quarterly magazine, "The Metalsmith." They're also expected to lead a workshop on the topic (or other educational service approved by the board).
