
Dick Carlson provides the ever-popular corn feed. I have ordered a hog, some chickens, and lots of garlic.

Produce at least four people who can make a small Calla lily in less time than it takes the average curious power / steam show visitor to get bored with the process. It is not Guild policy, but I would like to emphasize this to people who want to demonstrate for the public. (Become a demonstrator!!!!!!!!!!)

Think of this as a class for relatively advanced forgers, but there is no need for metallurgy. Wayne Olson was doing well on Armed Forces Day demonstrations in May.

I've shown the story board (Ring of samples really) at several meeting now. It is a fair representation of the lilies that grow near Larry Britton's place on the Scenic Hiway North of Hiway 2. Myron prepared the examples and Myron is lead teacher for this workshop. Cost is nominal (\$60) because we will not be spending a lot on materials. (3/8 Hot roll steel, coal and nominal rent.) We will organize room for eight, and I am not worried about filling the class. I've heard serious interest.

Bring: your favorite hammer





Gas welding workshop 22 Oct 2016

Details: Held at Myron Hanson's shop in East Eagan

Start as a new person to gas welding or improve your technique and knowledge of safety with an oxy/acetylene torch.

Myron has several teaching stations and, together with Bill the Welder© and Dick the Carlson, has produced capable and safe welders for several years now. Ask anyone who has taken this workshop for their recommendations and comments.

Cost is nominal. Class will start at 9 AM and run until 4:30 PM. Coffee will be provided. Bring a bag lunch, or there are a couple of local restaurants. It will be acceptable if you choose to bring your own welding kit to get familiar with it. There is room for eight attendees.

Register early. This one has always sold out. Two of us are organizing this for the instructors, as we expect them to be very involved with the students. (And because Bill $\mathbb C$ thinks Herb really needs his help with welding skills.)

NOTE: Herb's observation is that, in general, our members are far too willing to loan their torch to whoever implies that they have used one in the past. I (Herb) believe there are important safety concepts that are associated with those who borrow my torch, and this class is a good opportunity to learn those concepts.

We will be making steel Friday and Saturday. Later Saturday, (Saturday evening) and on Sunday, we will continue by making tools from our steel.

With the steel you have made you can make a tool of your choice, (send blue prints to us prior to class) a chisel, gouge, or cutting edge tool.

In addition to the class we will be working on the \$500# Little Giant Hammer. We will use it to forge and weld a heavy damascus billet.


