Am I making it sound like I enjoy this?


The madness is nearly upon us...38 years & counting!


Suffolk latch set and strap hinges class

Instructor: Lucian Avery, conference demonstrator

Thursday & Friday, Sept. 17 & 18

Little Log House grounds, Hastings, MN (map below)

Size: 8-10 students Cost: \$150. Skill level: high/intermediate/advanced





On day one, Lucian Avery, demonstrator for the fall madness, will lead you in the construction of a Suffolk Latch with your choice of interior or exterior latch. Then on day two you will work on strap hinges with choice of pintles. The latch is forged from a 3/8 X 1 inch cr steel The hinges will be forged out of ½ x 1 ½ cr steel with 3/8 round Pintles. A punch out of S7. If time allows, you will make your own nails.

Tools: Bring your own favorite tools: favorite good quality cross peen hammer, sharp, handled, half-round, double-cut file, about 8" long, your favorite striking sledge, and 2 C clamps for clamping the hot hinges. Common shared tools will be provided. 1 thick, flat table or plate at least 8"x30" for flattening the hinges. Grinder or belt sander for working the S-7.

Beginners Blacksmithing Classes 2015 / 2016

When: Classes are held on four Saturdays from 9-4. Four sets of classes are held this Fall, Winter and Spring. All 4 sets of classes teach the same information. You can choose either the A, B, C, or D set of classes.

Cost: Total cost for the class is \$120. First, you must be a member. If you are not, you can join for \$30 per year. The workbook/study guide is \$15 and the 4 classes are \$105 for a total of \$120. This covers everything you need, the facility, coal and metal.

Where: The A, B, C classes are held at the Minnesota School of Horseshoeing, 6250 Riverdale Dr NW, just off Hwy 10 in Anoka near the Anoka Vocational College. The D set of classes are held in Cleveland, MN near Mankato.

Why take the beginners basic classes:

The beginners basic classes are designed to give everyone the same understanding of the basics, techniques and terminology. The basic classes are required before taking any of the many other classes the Guild offers. This enables those classes to concentrate on advanced techniques without having to spend time on basic concepts.

What you need to bring:

Eye, ear and skin protection. This includes safety glasses, ear muff or plugs an suitable clothing which includes hard shoes, cotton or leather. Synthetic and polyester clothing will burn and melt. There will be sparks and brushes against hot metal.

Tools: Bring your favorite hammer. A small 1 to 2 pound ball peen hammer would work. We have various hammers for you to try and get a feel for what is comfortable. We have all the punches, chisels and tools you will be using but feel free to bring your own tools if you have them.

What you will learn:

The first 3 Saturdays you will learn the basic techniques including: Safety, Forging Dynamics, Hammer Techniques, Fire Building, Drawing out, Upsetting, Punching, Bending, Twisting, Heat Treating, Scrolling, Splitting

The fourth Saturday will be self paced to build a few items that will include each of the techniques you learned earlier. Instructors will help guide you thru any number of possible projects such as a forge rake, watering can, forge poker, spoon, shovel, tongs, candlestick holder etc. This is a good opportunity to try out all your new skills.

Who are the teachers: The instructors are all volunteers with a wide range of experience, talents and stories. They range from just finishing the basic beginners class to 30 years. There is usually at least one instructor for every two students and many times we have had as many instructors as students.

Who are the students: The students come in all ages and experience. We have had 10 year olds and 70 year olds. There are always a few women in each class. Some students have never held a hammer before. Some students are skilled in other crafts, woodworking, glass, welding, pottery and want to learn more about metal work to work it into their craft. Some students are nearing retirement and want to learn a hobby. All share an interest in learning more about blacksmithing.

Typical day:

Classes start at 9 but people usually show up much earlier to get the coffee brewing, have a donut, swap stories or show off recent projects. Feel free to bring projects you are working on to show. We break for lunch. You can either bring a brown bag or go out to a local fast food restaurant.

Exploring Steel of the Viking Age, Ric Furrer, August 28, 29, & 30, 2015: Students will make damascus sword steel or Wootz steel of the Eastern world. Ric did a PBS Nova presentation recreating the Viking Sword. This is for folks who want to do hands-on work that have blacksmithing experience. Others can audit the class. We will make steel Friday and Saturday. Afternoon and evening on Saturday and Sunday will be making tools from the steel.
