### Make a pair of 'Poz" style tongs!

Where: Minnesota School of Horseshoeing

When: Saturday, December 10, 2011

Cost: \$40 per student

Class size: Minimum 5, maximum 8. NOTE: There are still 3 openings for this class as of Nov. 30!

Prerequisites: Blacksmithing basics class required

Instructors: Darryl Ponder (952-401-3266), Gordon Barr, Rich Herman

What to bring: Your favorite hammer, safety glasses, hearing protection. Other tools, materials provided.

You are warmly invited to spend a December Saturday learning how to make a pair of "Poz" style tongs while gathered around the heat of the coal forges at the MN School of Hoeseshoeing! These tongs, originally designed by a Mr. Richard Pozniak of Chicago, refined by Robb Gunter, and refined further still and championed by our own Monty Bygd, can hold square, round, and flat stock all with a single pair of tongs. We will be making a pair designed to hold 3/8 inch square or round stock, and quarter inch flat.

Each participant should leave with a finished pair of tongs. However, this will be somewhat dependent upon the experience level of the participant. I find that the drawing out of the reins (handles) takes some time, as does the accurate slitting of the stock when forming the jaws. If you are comfortable in these processes, you should be able to finish your tongs. We will be bending around some jigs, riveting, and generally having a good time. None of the processes is hard, and everyone will at least learn how to make these tongs while back in their own shop.

You will learn the simple tooling required to make a pair of these tongs and will receive reference material that you may use in the future after you leave class and start making additional Poz tongs on your o wn.

Bring your favorite hammer. Other tooling will be provided or made by you onsite.

- Beginners Class A in session now and flowing smoothly with the Controlled Hand Forging curriculum.
- Discussion of the pre-conference workshop; all feedback was positive and it went so well that it may become standard for the conference. Good for the demonstrators and the students alike. Largest class attendance (20 people) due to 10 teams of 2 people.
- Intermediate Class will be 3 days long. Looking for instructors. Pre-class workshop for instructors on Dec. 4<sup>th</sup> at the School of Horseshoeing; will review the curriculum and practice forging.

#### Program Committee- Hicks, Vice Chair- Rob Murray

- Successful and joyous membership meeting at the Jackson Street Roundhouse. GOM members have donated enough time to offset the rental cost for another meeting there.
- December meeting is ready. 2012 meeting possibilities are O.S.C. and Tom Sanders to lecture on an archeological dig of an old blacksmith site.
- Bob Patrick has verbally agreed to demo at 2012 Madness and pre-con workshop; contract in process.
- Possible subcommittee to be created to handle pre-con workshop; may be Prog-comm or Ed-comm or rep from both.
- Big up's to Derrick Philips for installing the vents in the trailer.
- Looking at work samples of people who can demonstrate non-ferrous forging for the conference.

- The November Forum went out. The Metalsmith should hit the press soon and was delayed due to the editors computer crashing.

ADJOURNMENT: 9:22 pm, Motion by Pansch, second Hicks, accepted without dissent.












### Greetings, fellow members,

For those who might be interested, the people at the Jackson street round house are looking for more volunteer work to be done, contact them directly but let them know you are from the guild.



# Tinsmithing, Kitty Latane', April 21 and April 22, 2012 (two one-day classes)

Come to Tunnel Mill and learn a century-old craft, Tinsmithing with Kitty Latane' from Pepin, Wisc. Design and make your one of a kind tin cookie cutter and other simple tin projects, including flour scoops and candle scones. In this one day workshop you'll learn traditional techniques for cutting, shaping, and soldering tin plate. \$65.00 per day plus \$15.00 material cost. Limit of 10 students. Class 9am to 5pm. Bring sack lunch.

#### Seventeenth Century Battle Axe or Hewing Hatchet, Tom Latane', April 20, 21, and 22, 2012

Students will forge an axe with a tapered rectangular eye socket. This shapely early form is made up of three pieces rather than the two used to produce an axe with a simple wrapped eye.

Parts will be forged to shape from 1/4" and 1/2" thick mild steel, forge welded together and further forged to refine. A high carbon steel bit will be welded between layers of low carbon steel, shaped, hardened and tempered. Students wishing to create a hewing hatchet may leave the blade thicker and less broad with the high carbon steel welded to one side rather than in the center of the edge. The low carbon body of the axe will remain soft enough that it can be decorated cold with punches (at home if there is not time in class) as the early ones were.

Class cost, time of day, and other details coming soon.
