

Each student will take home a large handled block wire brush and a can of flux. There will also be some specialty tongs for sale which is optional. Students will be provided the use of these tongs for the class and are not obligated in any way to purchase them

Class is limited to 8 students. Materials included: can of EZ Weld heavy duty wire brush, fuel and iron.

Cotton or non synthetic clothing, safety glasses, leather shoes,etc Bring tongs that properly fit 3/8 inch round and square stock in both directions--parallel and perpendicular to the tong reins.

This is more than an introduction to the basics of forge welding, and completion of Blacksmithing Basics recommended. Some forge welding experience/experimentation is helpful. Class will include, simple forge welds to begin with, progressing to more specialized welds: a series of forge welds to practice what you have learned.







Dear Members,
