


# **Gordon Williams**

# **Ernie E. Dorrill III**

**Ernie** has always enjoyed working with his hands and with an educational background in architecture from Mississippi State University, design has been an integral part of his life both professionally and as a pastime.

Because of his architectural background, a natural progression toward Gothic and Renaissance work was inevitable. The use of hand tools with over a thousand years of history behind them for chasing, repousse' and piercing, much of which is in combination, along with layered effects produced visually rich intricate patterns. Ernie said "I'm still inspired by the work produced by George Dixon, Tom Latane' and Carl Close but also by those unknown smiths of 13<sup>th</sup> through the 18<sup>th</sup> century who produced beautiful work 10 hours a day and then went home for a modest meal only to get up the next morning and do it again".

Ernie does this work as a mental and physical challenge. He said, "My goal is to inspire others to push themselves past their perceived limits of the possible to the impossible. There is an enormous degree of satisfaction in seeing others excel in the wonderful adventure of traditional metal work. For Ernie, this has been one of the most rewarding pastimes in which he has participated and for those who want to learn, his doors have always been open.




