### Features:

This meeting features and is known as The Corn Feed. Dick Carlson has put his heart into this for years. Some of us have humbly joined in the effort. Mike Alm set a new, very high standard preparing ribs for the June meeting. The August crew will try to do a good job.

Herb, Jim and Gary plan to roast another hog. We do not promise to cut back on the garlic (unless someone has a good reason). Apprentice hog roasters are always welcome. Once again a few chickens will be prepared for those who avoid pork. Recognize the chickens will be prepared by smoking and secondary roasting in the cavity of the hog. (Some have dietary restrictions.)

Dan has a unique collection of ways to form metal sheets into almost anything you desire. He can demonstrate all of these and offers to take requests. Dan's equipment mix has changed again this year, so do not think that you have already seen it all. He has also expanded the space under cover so we are less subject to weather. Dan often allows members to experiment with a machine: your liability. You might learn to handle a machine that will shrink, stamp, fold, staple or mutilate 10 gage steel very carefully. (Often someone demonstrates the effect of an "English Wheel" on a finger.) Safety officers take note! This paragraph is from last year, and is still the current information.

This is family and friends night. We have had some wonderful evenings at Dan and LuAnn's park-like setting. Show and tell will be good. Do everything you can to be there. This is intended to be a very family friendly and social meeting. To emphasize the family concept I have asked Seth Merritt (a young blacksmith) to demonstrate projects that members can adopt for demonstrations at places like the power shows and fairs. They will be products that you can afford to offer to the onlookers either free or for less than \$20.



## TGoM President's Message...

### WHERE'S MY 'METALSMITH'?

We have received a number of questions recently from concerned or confused members wondering if they somehow fell off the mailing list or otherwise missed the last edition or two of *Metalsmith*. The good news is, no, you didn't miss anything. The bad news is that there hasn't been a *Metalsmith* published since the winter.

### WHAT HAPPENED?

A single point of failure finally caught up with us. By that I mean that everything that happens in The Guild, from balancing the checkbook to loading chairs at the end of a meeting, is accomplished by the altruistic effort of volunteers... and our bench isn't always as deep as we would like. Despite recent improvements, some mission-critical roles still have only one person — with no back-up. 



Call to Order: 7:09 PM by Martin Pansch. Members in attendance: Barr, Bettenberg, Dodge, Gavin, Lockwood, Pansch, Philips, Sheely, Wasmund, Widenhofer. Missing: None. Visitor(s): Dan Osadchuk

Approval of previous meeting's minutes: Motion to accept by Wasmund, second by Phillips. Motion passes.

### **COMMITTEE REPORTS:**

Treasurer Report: Grace Sheely See separate detailed report.

**Membership Services Committee: Chair Barr** 

Monica Walzak and Grant Bakken working on migration to NEON CRM. Grant to fix PayPal interface with NEON. Still discrepancies between databases but work is progressing. Expect to use NEON for the first time for August publication and set up a table at the Madness for people to check it out and pay dues via PayPal.

### **Education Committee report: Chair - Wasmund, Vice Chair- Marty Masters**

Nowthen Hammerin – 30-35 people came through on Saturday. Friday and Sunday were dead. Committee hasn't gotten briefing on how the Joinery class went but public reviews seem positive. Pre-conference class has two folks signed up already out of 12 available slots. Discussion on whether shop rent should be paid, how much and to who, for classes at Jackson Street Roundhouse (JSR). Education committee to discuss and make recommendation to board. New 3-day beginner class format to be rolled out starting October. Beginner projects will be separate classes. Pricing still being worked out.

### Program Committee: Chair-Lockwood, Vice Chair- Derrick Phillips

August meeting at Dan Pate's: ad it published. Myron running open forge, Seth Merritt to help with demos. No Silent Auction champion yet, several models being discussed to continue with event. Dodge to check hotel reservations to make sure it covers Lyle and Stan's Wednesday arrival. Venue for October meeting not set yet, maybe Linders? A possible bonus Saturday meeting at USA Knife Maker discussed, Wasmund to talk to Tracy on subject. December Christmas party to likely be 2 December at CSPS.

### Communications Committee: Chair-Bettenberg, Vice Chair-Vacant

Alissa resigned as editor. Metalsmith damage control. Short term and longer term actions discussed. Possible editor/editorial committee. Asa Pearson to possibly help. Café Press shop being revamped, Bettenberg to look for a possible volunteer to get it in better order to make keyword searches function better. Discussion on possible slide show by Juliet on Friday night at the conference and/or running continuous. Grace to see if Juliet is up for it. Demonstration PR kits status in serviceable shape. Banners seeing wear. Small banners being used more than large ones.

### **UNFINISHED BUSINESS:**

- Discussion of Guild positions that need to be filled: Treasurer, Metalsmith Editor, Program committee chair, Recorder, President, mail person. Possible volunteers named for President and Treasurer positions. Gordon volunteered to be the mail person. Suggestion on the growth and care of volunteers included discussion on "crew" t-shirts, bandana, gaiters.
- New chairs purchase, Phillips moved and Lockwood seconded to approve up to \$4,000 for purchase of new chairs and carts for tables and chairs. Motion passes. Gavin to purchase one cart full of chairs first to ensure cart will work with new trailer without major mods.
- Long range planning regarding facilities, given the high payoff to low cost of our partnerships with other organizations (School of Horseshoeing and JSR) perhaps looking for other partnerships would be more cost effective than pursuing our own standalone facility. Discussion ensued.

### **NEW BUSINESS:**

Possible award nominees. Pansch to develop a form to field at The Madness for membership to nominate candidates. Two more demonstrations have arisen in early October. Grace to look for tank papers for welder donated to Guild at JSR.


Please no Aluminum or Zinc. We are just using wire feed equipment.


