# Meet the Instructor: Dan Osadchuk

My earliest memory as a child was walking into my grandfather's blacksmith shop with him and my dad. I was very young, maybe about 3. I had no idea what I was looking at hanging on the walls and ceiling, but I wanted to know everything about all that stuff.

My dad pulled me out of there—with his big hand holding mine, I knew I had no choice but to go along with him. Halfway across the farmyard I wanted to get back in there, so when my dad eased his grip, I jerked my hand free and ran back into the blacksmith shop. I can still hear my dad laughing as he chased me across the yard.

#### Q: How long have you been blacksmithing? Teaching?

I have been shaping metal for as long as I can remember—started heating it up first in the mid 70's.

#### Q: What drives you to teach?

I can't think of a more noble profession than that of a teacher. I feel obligated to pass on my knowledge of the craft and the money is good, too.

#### Q: What is the most common misconception that novice smiths have about the craft?

That they can make a knife first.

#### Q: Any tips for a new blacksmith?

Get the metal hot, hit it hard, know when to stop.

#### O: What is the most important quality of a successful blacksmith?

A wise man once told me "patience and perseverance".

#### Q: What is your favorite thing to make? Most challenging project (tried or accomplished)?

I make a lot of wizard bottle openers and give them away. Took the 3 day crucifix class at the Tunnel Mill with Bob Fredell, that was a challenge. It hangs in my kitchen and I walk by it every day.

#### Q: Who did you learn from? Is there a memorable lesson or anecdote you'd like to share?

I have learned much from the fall conference classes. The most memorable lesson I learned was when Bob Fredell kicked me out of the blacksmith shop at the Nowthen Threshing Show. Best kick in the pants I got in awhile. Immediately set out to step up my game. Thanks, Bob!

## Guild of Metalsmiths Board Meeting March 12, 2020 (Note date change)

Present: Gordon Barr, Peter Bettenberg, Christina Dodge, Jesse Gavin, Taya Gavin, Mark Lockwood, Derrick

Phillips, Larry Wasmund, Paul Widenhoefer, and Richard Zielike

**Absent:** Martin Masters

Called to order by Larry at 7:10. Minutes-m/ Gordon, s/Jesse, approved

**Treasurer's Report** – Taya-The checking account is \$15,477, Neon is \$5,640, and the savings account is \$59,141, giving us a total of \$80,258. We began replacing the forges at the MN School of Horseshoeing with \$1,636 being spent for the steel and the laser cutting of the individual forge parts.

**Membership Committee-**Gordon-252 paid members. We have about 50 individuals who are on the Bellows who are lapsed (or haven't been) members. We decided to handle them on a case-by-case basis.

**Communication Committee-**Peter- The March issue of the Metalsmith is almost complete. Kim is editing the June issue, and Asa is doing the December issue. September is unassigned at this time. Arms and Armor is getting a free ad in the Metalsmith for hosting our April Meeting. We were able to sell more guild merchandise at our February meeting at Oxygen Service Company.

**Education Committee**-Christina- Beginning "C" and "D" classes are finished along with the knife class and the forge welding class. The "E" class starts this week. We are in the process of setting up the 2020-2021 class schedule, although we might publish the class schedule in 6-month segments to allow a little more flexibility. Later in the meeting, we discussed instructor qualifications, class dynamics, and safety.

**Long Range Planning-**Paul-has been in contact with a realtor about different permanent locations where we could have classes and members could use equipment.

**Program Committee**-Derrick-April meeting is at Arms and Armor, June is at the James J. Hill Farm, and August is at Dan Pate's. The Little Log House contract for the Fall Conference was discussed, along with the scope of the building projects and the camping /electrical hookups. Pepe Gomez will be one of our demonstrators.

Total \$46,950

The biggest expenses are the Fall Conference (program), the Metalsmith (communications) and coal, which we will probably order this fall (management).

We discussed how the various guild emails get to their recipients.




