Here is the pitch for the help that it takes in addition to the stellar and consistent efforts put in by the Gavin crew for the meal.



Oxy/Acetylene Welding 2-day class

Saturday & Sunday, October 8 & 9, 9:00 am to 4:30 pm

Location: Myron Hanson's East Eagan Blacksmith Shop, 4015 Dodd Road, East Eagan, MN

Instructors: Myron Hanson, Bob Brown, and Dick Carlson

Cost: \$120 Guild member, \$140 non-member

Maximum students: 8

Class description: New to gas welding? Just want to brush up your basic skills? This class focuses on safety and handson learning. Students will be working at individual stations on a shared workbench, with equipment and stock provided. If time permits, bonus demonstrations will show advanced techniques and uses of the oxyacetylene torch.

Students should be prepared for sparks and melted/hot metal: common safety garb (leather footwear and clothing made of cotton, leather, or wool —no synthetics, no cuffs or frayed edges) plus eye protection with a #5 lens, either in a face shield (preferred), goggles or glasses. If you wear corrective lenses, bring those, too. Cloth cap is optional, gloves are recommended.

Tools and Equipment or other items participants are to bring to the class: All supplied, though students may bring their own torch if they'd like

Safety Equipment – common safety garb/gear plus eye protection with #5 lens

The Pierce County fairgrounds cashed our down payment check. Invoice and payment for the sanitation company for Nowthen Hammer-In have been brought up to date. Randy Purchase just gave a gift membership to a Guild member. Money donated to Guild is at the discretion of the board unless specified. We have about \$1300 in the Rich Herman Memorial Fund.

Education-Christina-Our bottle opener class is scheduled for July 16 in Northfield MN. On July 23rd the Boy Scout merit badge class will be at the Minnesota School of Horseshoeing. The class calendar for the year has been completed and given to Georgia, and the committee gave her the discretion of when to publish it. The Betty lamp class is not scheduled. The committee has had the last two months off.

Communications/Publicity-Kim-The website gallery was discussed, and we need to encourage more members to put their work on the website. We also discussed how often we need to update the Friends of the Guild and the places where we meet on the website. This is Part One of Three in a Joinery class series. A related project class will be taught this spring as we continue to spread these skills. The overall courses are skills based, to incorporate all that was learned in a class taken by the instructors and taught by Mark Aspery. In this first 12 hours of instruction the student will learn the importance of

proper tool making to accomplish successful joinery. We will concentrate this portion on forging tooling to perform ½" slot punching and drifting with ½" round and square drifts. 

Participants are given money to pay for a portion of their expenses and are expected to learn some new or poorly understood skill, and then to share what they have learned with other members and the public through an article in our quarterly magazine, "Metalsmith." They're also expected to lead a workshop on the topic (or other educational service approved by the board).
