

Do you fear the zombie apocalypse? Do thoughts of a worldwide economic collapse and pandemics send you scurrying for your bug-out bag? Or perhaps you just want a good chopping knife capable of doing some hard work? If so, we are offering a knife making class for you! 

**Description:** Sara Gries will share what she's learned from years of exploring/experimenting with brass and copper, specifically for this class the decorative potential of various processes: etching, creating patina (coloring) by means of chemical or heat reaction ("flame colouring"), plating and removal/abrasion. In addition, she will share tips for design (how to transfer your idea to the metal, how to make curves and fine areas appear visually smooth and balanced) and will demonstrate the practical application of cutting, piercing, and contouring techniques



and a micro-torch will be used for a few techniques.



# **GUILD OF METALSMITHS' BOARD MEETING January 11, 2023**

Called to order at 7:01 by President Larry Wasmund.

**Members present**: Gordon Barr, Taya Gavin, Mark Lockwood, Marty Masters, Kim Maas, Derrick Phillips, Paul Widenhoefer, Richard Zielike, Larry Wasmund and Paula Wasmund.

Absent Jesse Gavin. Guests: There were no guests present.

Minutes; Approved motion by Derrick, second by Marty. Passed unanimously.

Treasurer's report: Taya

Business #6965 \$ 8769.35 Business #7138 \$ 3470.57 Savings #7520 \$ 64696.32

Taya is still working on year end, which will be covered in March.

**Membership Gordon:** As far as membership Gordon relayed we are consistent with approximately 250 members. The exact same number of publications are sent out as last year.

**Program Derrick:** February 8 is the general membership meeting at the Minnesota Railroad Museum. There will be a potluck starting at 6:30. Myron Hanson will be doing demos on tool and bit sharpening. There will be open forging time at this meeting. We will also try to video the demo for later dispersal.

The April meeting is planned at Toll Welding pending verification. June has an event planned at the landing in Shakopee. August meeting is the hog roast at Dan Pates farm. September 15-17 is the Madness. Watch for further details from future meetings. There was some discussion of changing the June membership meeting to coincide with the Saturday Hammer-in at Nowthen, with a potluck and all-day demonstrations. Watch for further details in the Forum.

**Education:** As for Education; in the absence of Wayne and Christina, who have stepped down from the committee, these notes are a composite of other committee members present: Marty Masters will assume the chairmanship in July. Currently the Beginner's 2<sup>nd</sup> group has had day 1 of 3. Upcoming classes will include:

April Joinery 1 class. It still has openings.

May Hammer class.

The beginner and May hammer class will be advertised soon.

**Communications Kim:** The December *Metalsmith* has been sent to the publisher. The March copy of *Metalsmith* has been started. If you have articles, material, or pictures of your projects you would like us to see, they can be submitted for publication. Bryan Herman is working on an alternative discussion forum and message board for The Forum. It is called "Discord." The board is interested in a demonstration. Kim will try to set up a demo with him. Kim helped Georgia set up her new Guild computer.

**Long Term Planning Committee** A separate committee meeting was held in conjunction with this board meeting. A discussion was held on extending the use of the MTM.

**Old Business** Discussion was held about holding in-person meetings. We will continue zoom meetings during the winter. Hopefully we will be meeting in person in May. Larry is going to check to see if the DANBO is available. The subject of the new computer Georgia received came up. She now has it and likes it.

**Iron Menagerie update:** Peter Bettenberg and Mark Lockwood have recruited several smiths to do animal heads. They have started scheduling times for photographing the process.

**Coal Status** Several instructors felt there was plenty of coal left to finish out the year of classes. A tentative plan was made for a Sept delivery.

Archive Storage: The board determined that it would be more reasonable and easier to use if it were digitized.

**New Business:** Larry suggested doing an insurance comparison to see if there are any more reasonable premiums available. The discussion is tabled for now. There was discussion held about creating a dedicated funding account, to fund a permanent location for the Guild. It was felt that there was no reason we could not open an account. This will be taken up at a future meeting.

There was a short discussion on grant writing. It was reported to us that The Round House and the Chicago Fine Arts survive on grants. There was also a discussion on how to find grant writers at a reasonable cost.

Gordon indicated that he had another group of Scouts needing merit badges. Also, that he has been contacted to do a similar program with the Girl Scouts. He is looking for female volunteers to help and be role models.

Meeting was adjourned at 9:18.



# Beginners Blacksmithing Classes Spring 2023

Registration is now open for the three day Beginners Blacksmithing classes March 11, 18, 25 in Ramsey MN.

The beginners basic classes are designed to give everyone the same understanding of the basics, techniques and terminology. The basic classes or proficiency is required before taking any of the many other classes the Guild offers. This enables those classes to concentrate on advanced techniques without having to spend time on basic concepts.

This 3 day class covers the basics of: Safety, Tools, Fire Control, Forging Dynamics, Tapers (ribbon, fishtail, point), Twisting, Riveting, Shouldering, Upset, Cutting, Splitting, Punching, Heat Treat, Scrolling, Bending, Forge weld.

#### Cost

Covers everything you need: the facility, coal, metal tools and workbook.

\$180 for members, \$190 non members

Minors (under 18) must have a parent present. There will be no sharing of forges.

#### **Dates and Location:**

The classes are held on Saturdays at the Minnesota School of Horseshoeing, 6250 Riverdale Dr NW, Ramsey MN 55303, just off Hwy 10 near the Anoka Vocational College.

#### What you need to bring:

Eye, ear and skin protection. This includes safety glasses, ear muff or plugs and suitable clothing which includes hard shoes, cotton or leather. Synthetic and polyester clothing will burn and melt. There will be sparks and brushes against hot metal.

#### Tools:

Tools are provided but if you have a favorite hammer, punches, chisels and tools, bring them along. A small 1 to 2 pound ball peen hammer would work. We have various hammers for you to try and get a feel for what is comfortable.

#### Typical day:

Classes start at 9 but people usually show up earlier to swap stories or show off recent projects. Feel free to bring projects you are working on to show. We break for lunch. You can either bring a brown bag or go out to a local fast food restaurant. Classes end between 3 and 5.



It is intended as a tool to further our educational mission, to keep members up to date on current happenings, to publicize projects and workshops, a place for all members to express their opinions, concerns, learn more about each other—in short, to help us run our organization.

### **Guild educational grants**

There is grant money available for Guild members to study intermediate and advanced metalworking techniques.

The Guild educational grant program is designed to bring new skills into the metalworking community. Participants are given money to pay for a portion of their expenses and are expected to learn some new or poorly understood skill, and then to share what they have learned with other members and the public through an article in our quarterly magazine, "Metalsmith." They're also expected to lead a workshop on the topic (or other educational service approved by the board).
