Glenn Horr

Glenn has been creating hand-forged metalwork since 1977. In 1984 he moved to Berkeley Springs in the Eastern Panhandle of West Virginia and established Highland Forge.

Glenn's interest in metals and forging began in a high school shop class. He is primarily selftaught and continues to add to his repertoire of skills by attending workshops and regional and national blacksmithing conferences.

Using traditional techniques, Glenn creates functional and decorative work in steel as well as copper, brass, bronze and aluminum. He en-

joys working with materials that are so rigid in one form, yet yield to hammer and anvil when heated in the forge.

Known for his attention to detail and fine craftsmanship, he has been commissioned to do many architectural projects. Glenn also markets his work through juried craft shows and galleries.

He took his first blacksmithing class through the Pioneer Crafts Council at Mill Run, PA, and has taught workshops at Touchstone Center for Crafts each summer for the past twenty + years. He has also shared his techniques through several conference demonstrations in the region.

Glenn creates a wide range of hardware for homes--anything from fireplace equipment to door hardware and railings, gates, to fine kitchen utensils. He also has worked with several churches creating a wide range of ecclesiastical work. He enjoys working with individuals, designers, and architects on special commissions, including new concepts and renovations.

Allan Kress of Alabama started blacksmithing in 1992. Early on he took Classes with Clay Spencer, Bob Bergman, Francis Whitaker, Peter Ross and Jerry Darnell. He began teaching at John C. Campbell Folk School in 1995 and has continued teaching a small projects class there ever since. Over the years Allan has demonstrated for many groups all over the Southeast, Northeast and Central U.S.

Allan splits his blacksmithing time between making power hammer and hand tools to sell at conferences, making tire hammers, and making sculptural art pieces to sell at art shows. In his many



years of tool making and selling to other blacksmiths he has been given the opportunity to receive feedback, suggestions, and tweaks to make the tooling better. He often makes tools which will perform several different tasks. In his personal work he uses many jigs and fixtures to simplify, speedup the processes and aid in the duplication of the same things over and over. As a showing artist for over 30 years he has a unique insight into that world and ways to boost your production while keeping the creative juices flowing.




Sunday's mini auction will be of the demonstrators' weekend works.


