Frank has been active in as a blacksmith and teacher with many years of experience, and is the founder and director of the Turley Forge Blacksmithing School in Santa Fe. He currently teaches at all the major craft schools, and was the featured presenter at the Canadian CANIRON II conference in Alberta. In addition was awarded the "New Mexico Award of Honor" for his publication "Southwestern Colonial Ironwork". Frank will be demonstrating traditional forged building hardware and more.

Kirsten Skiles is best known for her chasing and repousse work in copper, steel and other metals. Many of her creations are naturalistic relief panels and draws on imagery of the Midwest, childhood memories of those great illustrations in children's book's and fairy tales. Repousse is the relief decoration of metal, produced by hammering from the back so that the decoration projects and is one of the oldest technique's used to decorate metal.

Bill is very well known to many for his extensive research in Mokume-Gane and Pattern-Welded Steel (Damacus), his active participation in ABANA (Artist Blacksmith Association of North America) as president, board member, and perhaps most of all for the beauty of his creations. As a ABS Mastersmith he has written, demonstrated, and produced some of the knife work in the country.

Family activities are going to be greatly expanded this year. With a clean indoor building, we will be providing a number of activities and it's time to convince the family to join you for the weekend. Sherri Stanaitis it leading a new program featuring multiple demonstrations, and hands on projects.
