
TGOM Board

The building contains the lifetime collection of swords once owned by the late Ewart Oakeshott. Mr Oakeshott was a leading authority on European arms and armor. His collection contains more than 75 pieces and spans nearly 4,000 years of history. Included in the collections are a sword from the First Crusade, and a Scandinavian sword from the Bronze Age.

Ewart Oakeshott died in 2002 at the age of 86. His legacy lives on through the work and efforts of The Oakeshott Institute, a 501c(3) nonprofit education and research Institute.

Treadle Hammer Kits Available


Treadle hammer kits are now available from Discount Steel for \$325. The kits have all the steel precut to size and include all the nuts, bolts, spring, UHMW, turnbuckle and bushings needed to build the hammer. Drilling, tapping, grinding, deburring and welding are required to assemble the pieces.

The kits will be available through Discount Steel's website; www.discountsteel.com. Look for the photo on the front-page under "Featured Items." Place the order on-line and pay by credit card or cash when picking up the kit from Discount Steel. After payment is received, you will be able to download a 50 page set of drawings from their website. The entire kit weighs about 350 pounds and will be packaged on a small pallet for pick up. They will load so be prepared with a truck, van or trailer.

Build a Gas Forge

When: Saturday, May 7, 9:00 am until done around 4:00 pm

Where: Class will be hosted by Jody Emmings at Hot House Metal,

1161 Selby Ave., St Paul, MN 55104 Instructors: Jim Moenck, Wes Peterson

Cost: \$125

Class size: Maximum 10, minimum 6 students

This is a one day workshop in which we will make a venturi burner style gas forge. The forge will be a single burner model. The body will be approximately 10" diameter by 12" deep, made with a helium tank. This forge will be insulated with a 1" blanket of ceramic fiber, coated with a cementuous finish for durability. Fire brick will be used for the floor and sliding doors on each end, making it possible to pass the stock through, to heat the center of a work piece. The forge sits in a saddle, and is bolted to it for stability. This forge is a simple, economical forge. It will have a new burner design this year that gets very hot!

Tools & equipment: The class manager, Jim Moenck, will contact participants to see if they have any equipment that can be used.

Safety equipment: Safety glasses & ear plugs are mandatory. Other items that could be brought include cotton clothing, gloves, leather shoes or boots.

Lunch arrangements: Bring your own lunch, or eat at a local establishment. Luce Pizza is just a half block away, if you like a good pizza. With the prep work we will have done for the class, we should be finished by 4:00. Bring your own beverages to stay hydrated during the day (non-alcoholic, of course).

Upcoming in 2011...

Bread Oven class: Build and bake in a portable brick oven, May 7, 2011. Join David S. Cargo at Tunnel Mill to learn how to build a portable stacked-brick oven. After the oven is built, it will be fired up while students learn how to make dough for flatbreads, pizza and bread. Bake (and eat) all these in the brick oven. Class runs 9am-5pm, May 7, 2011. Bring a light sack lunch, we will sample products made around mis afternoon. You will leave with knowledge in baking and building and also plans to build your own oven. Fee to be collected at class is \$60.00 per student.

Tom Latane: Door hardware class, May 20, 21, 22. Students will forge a spring latch with a ring handle. The forge welded ring handle will be mounted on a shaft which will pass through a chisel-cut escutcheon, (the door), and then a chisel cut latch plate and be secured to a forged cam which will lift the latch bar. The latch bar will be under pressure from a spring, forged as part of the staple which retains the bar against the latch plate. The spring provides a more positive catch than a gravity latch. Parts will be forged, filed, and fitted. May 20, 21, 22, 2011

Bernard Heer: 3-day class on June 3, 4, 5 is cancelled due to a change in Mr. Heer's plans. He has a chance to work on a six to seven month project in Beijing, China, and obviously could not pass it up!

Roger Degner: June 11 & 12, Roycroft hammered copper vase, Quarters mokurne, pipe forging from chili peppers to flowers

Peter Ross: 2-part class June 20, 21, & 22 and June 24, 25, & 26, 2011. If you missed his 2010 class, plan now to attend! We are discussing the possibility of tool making for the first 3 day class..more than likely a hacksaw, the second 3 day class would be making a Betty Lamp with a flip lid, or Bracket part II (covering water leaves, flat leaves, more forge welding). Don't miss this opportunity to study with this Williamsburg Blacksmith. We still have 3 openings in Peter's class.

Mike Blue: Damascus II, July 8, 9 and 10. Advanced patterning techniques. This class is intended to spend time in further pattern development beyond simple welding of a flat laminate and the incised patterns discussed in the previous class. Any beginners should really try to keep their projects within this domain. The complex patterns discussion will be beneficial but not an expectation

We will discuss the development of the original mosaic designs found in European shotguns and the concepts involved in upset patterns like the current favorite "W" pattern and it's many variations including parquet development and the techiques to bring out that pattern on the surface of the billet. Another subject will be powder metal mosaic forms. This will include tool development for pattern manipulation and assistance in welding.

Anyone who wishes to explore the W pattern can bring along a lower layer count billet they prepared before the class. There will be less time talking and more time forging this go around. We're moving up into complex patterns where materials preparation will require a lot more time and the possibility of weld failures more likely.

Nathan Robertson: August 6, Heat Treated Hammer Class Choose your hammer, shape, and size.

Doug Wilson: Date Sept. 8, 9, 10, and Sept. 11, 12, & 13 Doug was a demonstrator at Guild of Metalsmiths Conference 2010 Doug will do two 3-day classes.

1st class—Working on lighting with electricity and mica. This is a change from the originally scheduled class on tool making.
2nd class: 3 day Drawing & Design: Drawing, design, and transforming ideas to metal
