The February meeting will be held at



#### Letter to Guild Members from Bob Walsh


In the last issue of the *Metalsmith* Chris Rand wrote an article about edge texturing dies for power hammers. He featured dies used by Tom Kelly, himself and the dies I use.

I can load up a Johnson gas forge with 5' pieces of 3/16" X1" for example and by heating, edge texturing, straightening, rotating and repeating, can texture a lot of metal in a short period of time. With this process, the dies work great.

However, the reason I am writing this, is because for the first time, the other day I tried texturing some metal cold in the dies. This worked, but I would consider the tool for this process a failure.

I would consider the dies a failure for edge texturing cold metal because they are held in place by a bolt and the whole unit is held in place by another bolt. As such, the shock of the cold metal being hammered knocks everything loose all too often. About every five minutes I had to re-tighten the loose bolts plus felt real-uneasy using a tool that was all too often, hopping around in the hammer. This is how you get hurt.

If you are planning to edge texture cold metal, don't waste your time replicating the dies I presented. If you do, you will be disappointed. If your metal will be hot, the system works very well.

Bread Oven class May 7 (details next month)

**Tom Latane:** Door hardware class, May 20, 21, 22. Students will forge a spring latch with a ring handle. The forge welded ring handle will be mounted on a shaft which will pass through a chisel-cut escutcheon, (the door), and then a chisel cut latch plate and be secured to a forged cam which will lift the latch bar. The latch bar will be under pressure from a spring, forged as part of the staple which retains the bar against the latch plate. The spring provides a more positive catch than a gravity latch. Parts will be forged, filed, and fitted. May 20, 21, 22, 2011

Bernard Heer: 3-day class June 3, 4, 5, possible tool making, animal heads and some copper raising. Bernhard is co-author and illustrator of the book "Basic Blacksmithing." The book is a result of experiences working with rural blacksmiths in Zimbabwe and Malawi.
