August 13 Guild meeting is social event of the summer!



Thanks for any help that you can give us.



TOM LATANE' ...CHASED DOOR KNOCKER CLASS—October 9, 10, & 11th, 2008

The students in this class will forge a door knocker in the form of an "s" scroll with a hinge mortisen into the upper

back. The top of the scroll will be in the form of a grotesque, dragon, or human head. The lower scroll will be chased

with the form of a stylized acanthus leaf.

There could be simple escutcheons around the pivot and the strike or the back plate could be a larger rectangle with chased borders.
