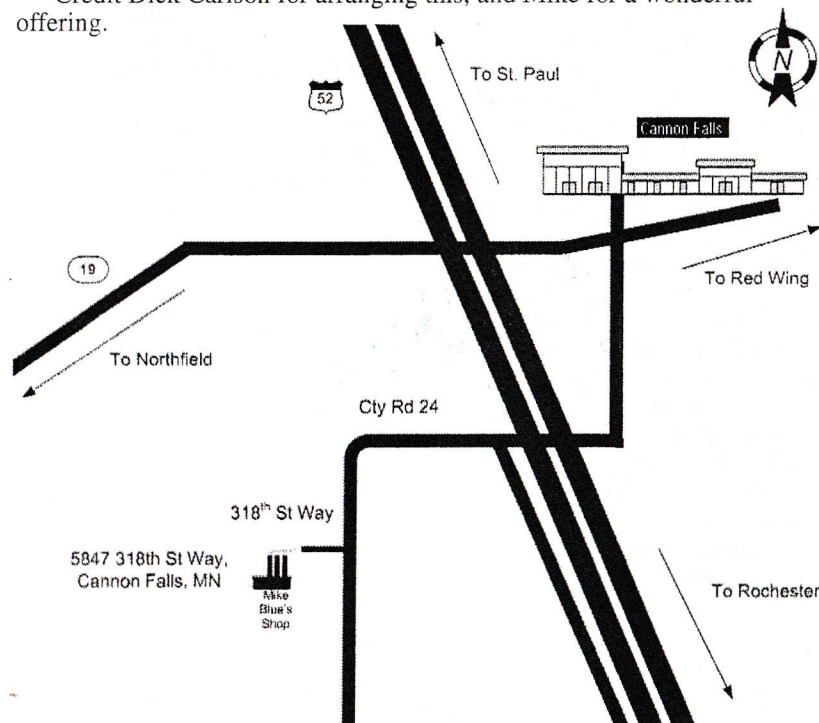
June 14 Guild meeting to be double feature

Here's another reason to keep your calendar up to date. Be sure to mark this date on it, as you won't want to miss out!

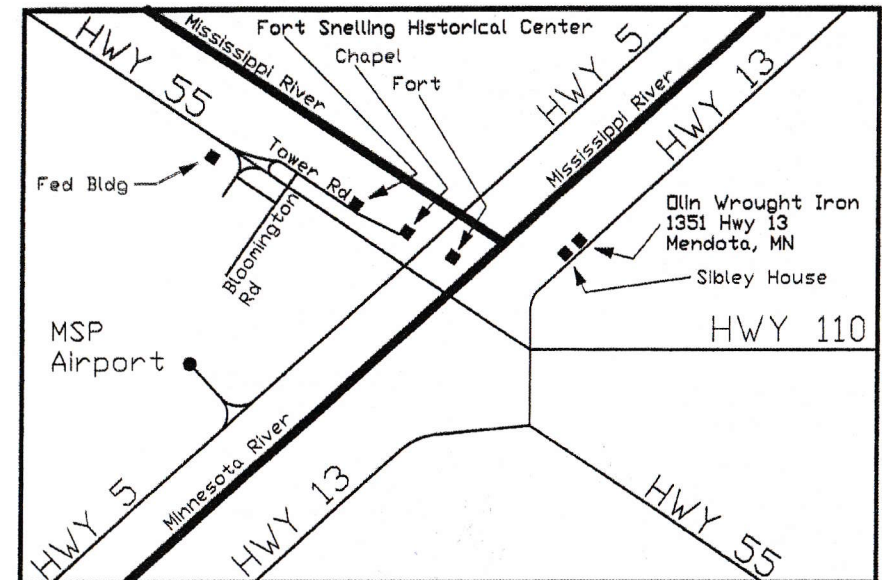
On August 9 the Guild of Metalsmiths will meet at Dave Olin's shop in Mendota. See map below.

techniques under Francis Whitaker. When Francis stopped teaching at John C. Campbell Folk School, he asked Clay to take over his classes. Clay continues to teach, leads workshops and demonstrates blacksmithing all over the US. He redesigned the treadle hammer twice and led workshops to build them. He is now leading workshops to build 50 lb. Tire Hammers. Clay was active in the Alabama forge council and served as writer and Editor of "The Bituminous Bits" and won ABANA's first Joe Humble newsletter Editor of the Year, 1994 Award. He served on the ABANA board for several years and received the Alex Bealer Award (ABANA's highest award) and Life Membership in ABANA in 1997. He is also lifetime member of the Alabama Forge Council and Blacksmith Association of Missouri.

Rauno Lehtonen: (Excerpted by Fick for brevity)

Rauno's career started in 1977 when he went to the agricultural-Blacksmith/Equine College in Finland. After two years he worked as a Farrier. In 1980 he worked as a blacksmith at a stonecutters smithy. In 1982 he rented an old cow house and started a smithy. At the end of the 1980's he was heavily involved in association activities and formed relationships abroad, first in Germany, then Sweden, Estonia, and other Baltic states. Trip Hammer Tooling, Techniques and Rebuilding, A Guild Video Review

If you want to know how to use, tool up or rebuild a trip hammer, then either one or both of this two-tape set is for you. Taped in May of 1995 at Rochester Welding in Rochester, MN, Master of the power hammer, Bob Bergman, gave a star performance. During that one day workshop he demonstrated the making and use of many tools for the power hammer and also managed the rebuilding of a 25# Little Giant.

We separated the tooling activity from the rebuilding activity and produced two separate tapes, each about 2 hours in length.

The Tooling and techniques tape is number T21A.

The Rebuilding tape is number T21B.

If you want to learn more about snappers, hacks, flatters, flat dies and more, then rent T21A. If your trip hammer clutch slips or your hammer doesn't hit very hard, rent T21B. If you are seriously thinking about getting a trip hammer or just recently made the "buy", then you ought to rent them both!

Education Committee Meeting Minutes, May 3, 2006

The Education Committee of the Guild of Metalsmiths was called to order at 7:05 P.M. on May 3, 2006. Members present were: Al Olson, Gordon Barr, Guy Paton, Herb Fick, Jesse Gavin, Joy Virden, Rich Herman and Jim Moenck. Minutes from March 3, 2006 meeting reviewed and approved.

Unfinished business

Jim Moenck inquired if anyone has had a response from ABANA regarding our suggestion that they have a meeting at their conference for the Education chairpersons this summer. No one has heard of any response from ABANA, so it appears no formal conference will be held for any exchange between clubs to see how they structure their educational format for learning.

The class schedule for 2006 – 2007 was reviewed, nothing was added.

Three additional opportunities for classes were presented, and agreed that they should be pursued. They are as follows:

Discussion was heard regarding class pricing. What is the basic for the cost of a class? Discussion was heard regarding how we find or recruit new instructors for classes. The following ideas were suggested:

- Utilize teachers from the Basics classes.

- Create a roster of all past teachers and the classes they taught, for reference purposes

The committee discussed having a "standard" form to read prior to each class. This could aid in the "liability issue" as well as give an instructor a basic guide, and could include safety as well. This will be discussed further at the next meeting.
