People who show up early will be treated to the historic tour by Guild member Carl Nordquist, who just happens to be the North Oaks village blacksmith and who helped restore the shop at the museum.

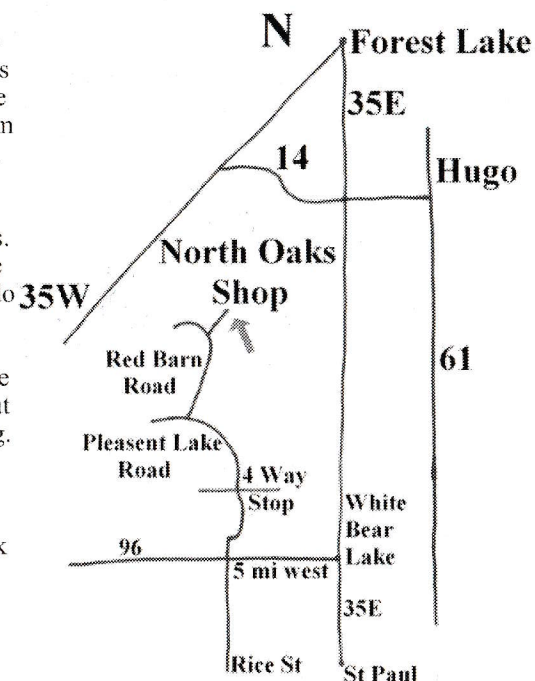
The program for June started out as an Education Committee discussion about the number of treadle hammers in The Guild that do not see a lot of use. Mindy Gardner did a nice showing of the tool when she demonstrated at the Madness, and long ago George Dixon did a nice Madness demonstration of the tool.

Herb Fick has talked Bob Walsh, Dave Mariette, Pete Stanaitis, and Jesse Gavin into offering to bring a few of their pet tools for treadle hammers to the meeting and demonstrate them.

We have space in the shop to show about three hammers. The differences in hammers is that people devise ways to make them safer, and they make tool carriers that make them very effective. They are not just for crushing cans.

We should have these people showing how to do a collar, make a leaf, do repousse', punch a hole, all showing how effective these things are if you put a bit of effort into tooling.

So mark your calendars now. This is your first opportunity to come sample the works of Nick Heinen, the new coffee guy and volunteer exceptionale! Potluck starts at 6:30, as usual.

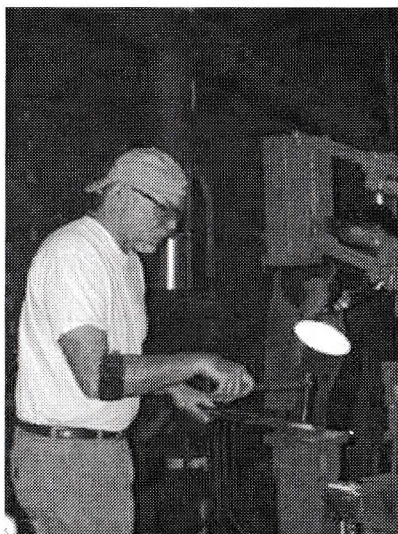
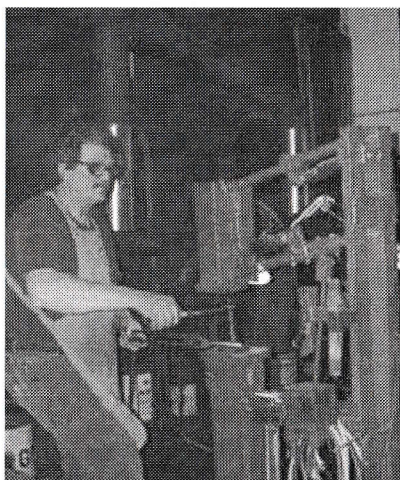

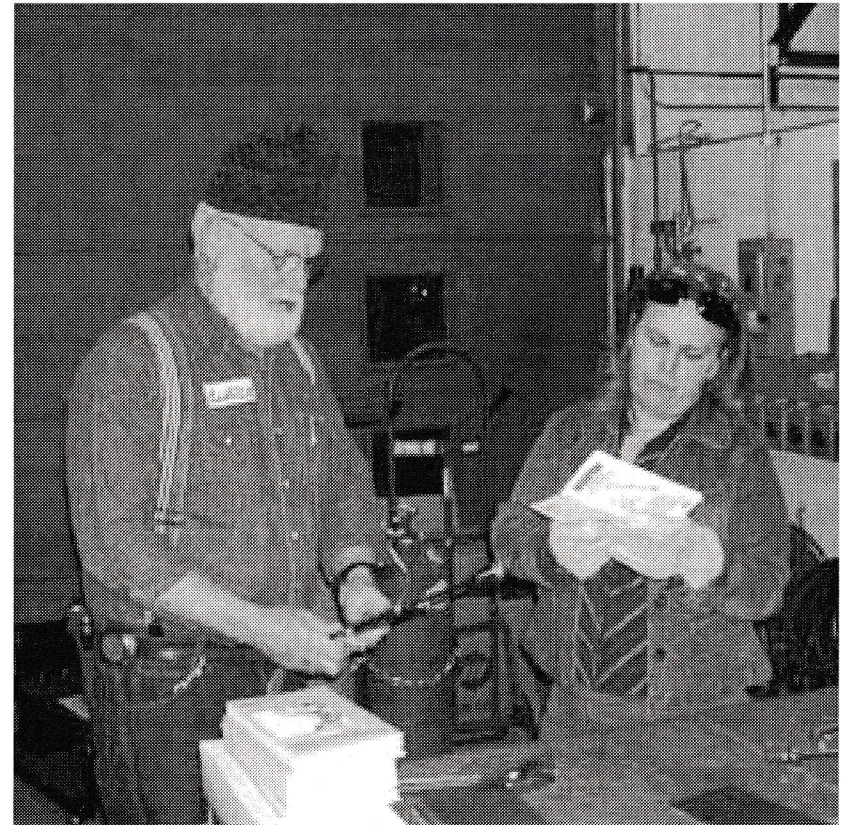
