Bronze pour planned for Nov. 10 to dedicate Dave Mariette's new shop!

Short notice but I will be having a bronze pour. It looks like it is going to happen Saturday, November 10 God willing and the creek don't rise. Why, you ask? Well, we need to make more hammers for the Juare-Hubler award. We (The Guild) cast a half dozen hammers, or so, about six years ago down at Tunnel Mill. They have all been awarded and we need more.

Also, my new shop is pretty much up and running. The problem is this: I still have a thirty two hundred square foot shop, but only four hundred and fifty square feet of it has a roof. For the most part this event will have to be outside. So, the sooner the better.

Activities to include: Ramming of flasks, heating of forge and bronze, pouring of bronze, and also, as the new smithy will be operational I would be honored if any that attend might step up to the forge and hammer out a leaf and put your mark on it. The leaves will become a part of the smithy. Kind of a symbol of the greater community of blacksmiths. As always a great time to network with other smiths so if you have a project of interest to share, bring it. So, this event will be officially be called a shop dedicationing, bronze pouring, hammer-ining, hot chocolate drinking et.al. extraviganza.

I will get out more particulars very soon as I put it together. I just wanted to get the invite out there. We may be able to pour some other small pieces if you can bring a pattern. I have silica bronze for pouring but not sure exactly how much so it maybe a case of BYOB if you want to make a small piece. As I said I will provide more information as I get it. The idea is to make the hammers, have some fun, and as usual learn something in the process.

The day should get under way around 1:00 PM. We'll provide chile and hot chocolate. May have some green chile stew also. If other beverages are desired by the participant, they should bring it along. Also, munchies to share would be a good thing to bring. Adult beverages OK but be responsible. Be discreet as there may be kids. Have a DD as necessary. A chair might come in handy.

I hope to start pouring just after dark which will be quite early as we will be off day light savings time.

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

Attention, Smithin' Magician door prize winners!

A notice for those lucky enough to have won a Smithin' Magician as a door prize. I've gotten a bit better at the assembly with each one offered as a door prize. I was down to one left, and it was, by golly, going to be mine.

Al Olson has now come up with enough tool steel to continue the program, assuming there are still a few members who would not turn one down. The first ones were all water Jet cut last October courtesy of Jet Edge (who incidentally has done some contract cutting for my son, and quite nicely too). Al is now involved in cutting the new stock at Myron's so now consider Myron as contributing a saw blade.

Now be aware that the S-7 tool blanks supplied are not just a simple piece of steel. They are supplied annealed. Do all the shaping you need and then, if you choose, harden by raising to a very high heat (Ask Pete Stanaitis about color, but it is more than beyond magnetic). Then air quench.

I am not recommending that the average newcomer try annealing for later shaping with saws and cutting tools, but the heat treating recipes to use are those for S-7. Try not to harden the battering end. Think Jack Hammer bit blanks.

Remember that plain carbon steel is often used in these tools. You might want to start by building a couple of sample tools as trial pieces.
