Are you tired of fumbling with that short piece of chalk? Then this is the class for you. We will be making chalk tongs. This class will require you to have some serious hammer control. One wrong hit, and you will likely be starting over. These tongs could also make a good Christmas tree ornament. If you'd like to look over the sample pair – they will be at the October Guild membership meeting . The tongs in the photo are  $\sim 6^{\circ}$  -  $7^{\circ}$  long

## Viking Knife Class

Date and time: Nov 15, 2025, 9am to 4pm

**Class Description:** 

The goal for this class is to introduce a smith to working with wrought iron and in the process make a couple of small projects: a hook and a small forge welded whittle tang knife that would have been common throughout the Viking era and beyond. In the morning we will be getting used to working with wrought iron by drawing out some bar stock and making a hook. In the afternoon forge welding high carbon steel to a bar of iron and then drawing out a tang and the blade to make a small forge welded knife. Time permitting burn in a handle and heat treat the knife.

The skill level for the class is anyone who can maintain a coal fire, work with tongs to draw out material, minimal scrolling, moderate hammer control, forge welding experience is not required. The class is not designed to be the first smithing experience.

## Tools and Equipment or other items participants are to bring to the class:

½" or 5%" V bit tongs (able to grab 3%" to 5%" round and square stock)
¼" V bit tongs (able to grab ¼" round and square stock), forging hammer, light weight forging hammer, course wire brush

**Safety Equipment:** the usual for forging with coal: gloves, safety glasses, hearing protection, clothing of natural fiber with no cuffs or fraying, and leather boots or shoes. Note that wrought iron is worked very hot and there will be a lot of scale.



Class Description:

This is Herb, organizing yet another Handled Struck Tools Class for the day before the holiday party. We are electing Bob Brown to be our lead instructor this year. The Gavins, Dave and Jesse, are anxious to see how Bob would lead the workshop.

We will still use 4140 AN steel; 5/8 and 3/4 diameter. We use this alloy because it is well known, makes a good tool, and makes a good example for teaching heat treating. The handle will be whatever Bob wants it to be as long as it uses 1018 rod. Special quench oil is supplied courtesy of the Northfield VFW.

The instructor's goal for the workshop is to produce students comfortable with the process of forging and heat treating tools from nominal tool steel. A secondary goal is to have the students comfortable with the use of treadle hammers.

Herb procures the stock and a literature package reviewing the heat treat principles and a bit of really ancient history. The principle reference used will be the book *Steel Metallurgy for the non-metallurgist* by John Verhoeven. (ISBN-13: 978-0-87170-858-8) This year's demonstrator at the fall conference, Howard Clark, made a contribution to that book and is a friend of Verhoeven. The book is available through the internet without charge.

Our crew has offered the workshop for quite a few years, and they have developed many ways to offer guidance on technique. Ask anyone who has taken the workshop. Rarely has anyone left the day with less than two working tools, punch or chisel.

A feature of this particular workshop is the use of treadle hammers. We usually have three or four available for the participants to try/use and we encourage participants to also try striking for each other. Or ask a helper to strike, to get a feel of how this is done in demonstrations at fairs and shows.

**Lunch** is brown bag, or area restaurants. We usually are shut down at 5 PM.

## **Beginners Blacksmithing Classes Winter 2026**

Registration is now open for the three-day Beginners Blacksmithing classes January 3, 10 and 17, 2026 Minnesota School of Horseshoeing, 6250 Riverdale Drive NW, Ramsey MN 55303 (Map page 7)

The beginners' basic classes are designed to give everyone the same understanding of the basics, techniques and terminology. The basic classes or proficiency are required before taking any of the many other classes the Guild offers. This enables those classes to concentrate on advanced techniques without having to spend time on basic concepts.

This 3-day class covers the basics of: Safety, Tools, Fire Control, Forging Dynamics, Tapers (ribbon, fishtail, point), Twisting, Riveting, Shouldering, Upset, Cutting, Splitting, Punching, Heat Treat, Scrolling, Bending, Forge weld.

Cost: (covers everything you need, the facility, coal, metal tools and workbook)

\$200 for members, \$230 non-members

Minors (under 18) must have a parent present. Minors under 14 need one adult per child.

There will be no sharing of forges.

#### **Dates and Location:**

The classes are held on Saturday, January 3, 10 and 17, 2026 at the Minnesota School of Horseshoeing, 6250 Riverdale Dr NW, just off Hwy 10 in Anoka near the Anoka Vocational College.

#### What you need to bring:

Eye, ear and skin protection. This includes safety glasses, earmuffs or plugs and suitable clothing which includes hard shoes, cotton or leather. Synthetic and polyester clothing will burn and melt. There will be sparks and brushes against hot metal.

#### **Tools:**

Tools are provided but if you have a favorite hammer, punches, chisels and tools, bring them along. A small 1-to-2-pound ball peen hammer would work. We have various hammers for you to try and get a feel for what is comfortable.

#### Typical day:

Classes start at 9 but people usually show up earlier to swap stories or show off your recent projects. Feel free to bring projects you are working on to show. We have a break for lunch. You can either bring a brown bag or go out to a local fast-food restaurant. Classes end between 3 and 5.

brary of historical videos that will be gone through to decide what would be up-loadable for the website. What will be needed going forward is a videographer/video technician.






